Background

The INTOSAI-Donor Cooperation (Cooperation) has taken the initiative to develop fact sheets for the purpose of increasing knowledge of member practices in supporting Supreme Audit Institutions (SAIs). Fact sheets have been developed for donor members who can provide financial support for capacity development. In addition, fact sheets have been developed for some INTOSAI members who can support capacity development for SAIs through their programme implementation.

About ADA

The Austrian Development Agency (ADA), the operational unit of Austrian Development Cooperation (ADC), plans, finances and supports programs and projects in Africa, Asia, South-Eastern and Eastern Europe and in the Caribbean.

ADA can provide funding, using different types of projects. Depending on the situation, on the demand on strategic approaches and available resources, ADA carefully chooses the type of project. See table 1 for an overview. These types of projects cover duration and delivery approaches, and are not mutually exclusive.

Programme Cycle and decision making

The decision on support to SAIs is taken at Headquarters. In ADC priority countries, local offices are part of the decision making processes. ADA does not have a defined programme cycle.

Strategic priorities for ADA

Priority countries

To consider supporting a SAI, the SAI has to be from one of ADA's priority countries. For an overview of the priority countries see table 2 below:

In addition, ADC supports specific programs in Iraq, Libya, Afghanistan and Ukraine.

Areas of strategic priorities:

To consider supporting SAI development programs, the projects need to be compatible with ADAs strategic priorities. ADA can provide support for projects in the following areas:

- Good governance
- Accountability
- Transparency
- Fighting corruption

While PFM and Public Administration reforms are not mentioned in the current version of the Three Year Program (ADA's strategic guidance), it is not precluded to support projects and programs in these areas.
